A graduate of the FBI National Executive Institute with a Master's in Applied Criminology from Cambridge, she was recognised with an OBE (2009), an Honorary Doctorate from Queen's University Belfast (2012), and a CBE (2014).

On leaving PSNI in 2014, Judith has worked as an independent leadership advisor and has served on several public bodies, including the Garda Policing Authority. She is Co-Chair of the Diversity Mark Independent Assessment Panel, a member of the Prison Service Pay Review Body, and in July 2025 became Chair of the Chief Executives' Forum in Northern Ireland.
